Ranchi: At the conclusion of the monsoon session of the Jharkhand Legislative Assembly on Thursday, the speaker said that many members give priority to party instructions rather than their public commitment and local problems. He appealed that the voice of the public should be given priority by rising above party politics.

He informed that the monsoon session of Jharkhand Legislative Assembly was held from 22 August to 28 August 2025. A total of 324 questions were accepted in this session, which included 107 short notice, 183 starred and 34 unstarred questions.

The speaker said that in this session, a total of 70 notices of zero hour were accepted and a total of 21 requests were received. A total of 34 attentions were received, out of which 20 were accepted and 4 attentions were answered in the House. In this session, 5 other state bills were passed along with the first supplementary budget,



which include Jharkhand State University Bill, Jharkhand Professional Education Institutions (Fee Regulation) Bill and Jharkhand Platform Based Gig Workers (Registration and Welfare) Bill.

Resolution passed to confer 'Bharat Ratna' honour on Dishom Guru Shibu Soren

The speaker said that the House unanimously passed a resolution to confer India's highest civilian award 'Bharat Ratna' to Dishom Guru Shibu Soren. New Delhi: The Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY), the world's largest financial inclusion programme, has completed 11 years, marking what the government described as a "transformative impact" on India's financial landscape.

Launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 28, 2014, PMJDY has opened over 56.16 crore accounts, with deposits now standing at Rs2.68 lakh crore, the Finance Ministry said today. Union Finance Minister

Nirmala Sitharaman said

the scheme has been central to bringing the poor and marginalised into the formal financial system. "Financial inclusion is a key driver of economic growth and development. Universal access to bank accounts enables the poor and marginalised to participate fully in the formal economy and benefit from its opportunities," Sitharaman said in her

Patna: Bihar police have sounded high alert and launched a massive manhunt after inputs about intrusion of three dreaded terrorists of Jaish-e-Mohammad into the state from

Nepal.According to the sources at dreaded terrorists associated with the state police headquarters, three Jaish-e-Mohammad, a Pakistan-

based terror outfit, had entered Bihar from Nepal recently.

"They had intruded into Bihar with an intention to strike a major terror attack in the country," a source said. Massive manhunt has been launched to nab terrorists identified as Hasnain Ali (native of Rawalpindi), Adil Hussain (Umarkot) and Mohammad Usman (Bahawalpur), sources said, adding that a public appeal has also been issued to share details with police about any suspicious activity. All security agencies have launched operations to trace the terrorists and nab them, sources added.

'NARI 2025' report reveals gaps in women's safety across Indian cities

New Delhi: While many metropolitan cities such as Delhi, Kolkata and Jaipur compete to be the best Smart City in the country, a new report released today here has revealed a disturbing truth—most of these have failed to ensure women's safety in public spaces. According to the first-ever National Annual Report and Index on Women's Safety (NARI 2025),



over 40 per cent of women residing in urban areas feel "not so safe" or "unsafe" in their cities. Concerns

over safety notably increase at night due to inadequate street lighting and lack of visible security measures.

The report, based on the perception of the women hailing from various walks of life, highlights widespread harassment faced by them in public spaces, including staring, catcalling, lewd remarks, and physical contact. These incidents have had a severe impact, with many female students dropping out of school and working women quitting their jobs for safety reasons. The study, conducted across 31

cities covering all states, is based on the responses of 12,770 women and aims to provide a data-driven framework to improve women's safety beyond mere crime statis-

Seven per cent of respondents reported experiencing harassment in 2024, with the highest vulnerability among young women aged 18-24. This figure is significantly higher than the 0.07 per cent of cases recorded in the National

Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) 2022 data, underscoring the vast under-reporting of such crimes.

Also, just 25% expressed high confidence that authorities would act effectively on safety concerns, while over 30% noted significant gaps or failure in ensuring safety. Major disparities existed by age, with younger women and students, especially those aged 18-24, reporting higher uncertainty and vulnerability.





Survey Conducted in Tetulmudi Basti for BCCL Resettlement Plan

Katras: A comprehensive survey was conducted by BCCL in Tetulmudi Basti, located in the Sijua area, under the Mudidih Colliery. The survey, led by Surveyor Sanjeev Singh, focused on mapping and measuring all public and basic infrastructure in the locality. The objective is to assess the land required for resettlement and rehabilitation of the local residents due to mining activities.

Key public places surveyed include Mansa Mandir, Hari Mandir, village well, Surya Sthal, Gram Thana (village police post), playground, community hall,



Shiv Mandir, Anganwadi Centre, club, and Chaupal. Using traditional land measurement techniques (Napi Jokhi), BCCL aims to prepare detailed data to determine the land required for relocation of these facilities. Based on this data, BCCL will formally request land allocation from the

district administration. The survey has generated optimism among the residents of Tetulmudi. Local resident Ravi Mahto expressed relief, saying, "Ever since the outsourcing company began operations here, villagers have been living in fear due to frequent blasting. We are

happy with BCCL's initiative. We fully support coal production that boosts the nation, but it must be accompanied by safe resettlement for us." Villagers have shown active participation in the survey process. Among those who supported the survey were Suresh Mahto, Ajay Mahto, Vishnu Mahto, Ashu Mahto, Sudama Mahto, Shankar Mahto, Sudhir Mahto, Suresh Chaudhary, Rakesh Chaudhary, along with several others from Tetulmudi Basti.

This initiative marks a significant step towards balancing coal production and community welfare in the region.

Tata Steel declares Annual Bonus for 2024-2025 Financial Year

Jamshedpur Memorandum Settlement dated 28th August 2025 has been signed between Tata Steel and the Tata Workers' Union, for payment of Annual Bonus for the accounting year 2024-2025.

As per the Memorandum of Settlement the annual bonus for the year 2024-2025 the total payout for eligible employees of all applicable divisions/Units of the Company on account of annual bonus for the year 2024-2025 will be Rs 303.13 Cr.

Out of this, for Divisions at Jamshedpur including Tubes, an amount of Rs. 152.44 Cr will be distributed as annual bonus



amongst approx. 11446 employees.

The minimum (at full attendance) and maximum (at actual attendance) annual bonus payable for 2024-25 will be Rs 39,004/-and Rs 3,92,213/- respectively. Since majority of our employees of the Steel Company are drawing salary/wages higher than the limit laid down in the Payment of Bonus (Amendment) Act, 2015, they are not eligible for bonus under the Act. Tariff 'maharaja' to 'Modi's Ukraine war': Peter Navarro's allegations against India over Russia trade

New Delhi, Agency: White House trade adviser Peter Navarro has yet again took a swipe at India over doing purchasing crude oil from Russia. He has been a staunch critic of India's trade policies with the country, be it the purchase of military equipment or energy.

While India has clarified that its policies on energy deals are guided by the offer in markets and the global situation, Navarro has accused India of playing a part in Russia's funding of the "war machine" in Ukraine.

A key aide of US President Donald Trump, Navarro is seen as a major force behind the US's retaliatory tariffs.

Trump had announced additional 25% tariffs on Indian imports over doing oil trade with Russia, a warning that took effect on Wednesday, August 27. Navarro has since been defending the move, targeting India for continuing to buy Russian oil.

Maharaja of tariffs'

The White House official has repeatedly



used this term for India, first making the comment just days after Trump's tariff announcement. He had justified US's move of not slapping similar penalties on China, Russia's largest oil buyer.

"It's important to understand that the rationale for the Indian tariffs are very different from the reciprocal tariffs. This was a pure national security issue associated with India's abject refusal to stop buying Russian oil," Navarro said as he called India the 'Maharaja

Over a week later, he again used the same term for India, this time in an opinion piece for the Financial Times. He termed India's oil trade with Russia "opportunistic" and "corrosive" to global efforts being made to isolate the Russian economy."As Russia continues to hammer Ukraine, helped by India's financial support, American (and European) taxpayers are then forced to spend tens of billions more to help Ukraine's defence. Meanwhile, India keeps slamming the door on American exports through high tariffs and trade barriers. More than 300,000 soldiers and civilians have been killed, while Nato's eastern flank grows more exposed and the west foots the bill for India's oil laundering," wrote Navarro.

Laundromat for Kremlin'

Peter Navarro intensified his attacks against India just a few days ahead of the additional tariff deadline again, this time calling India a "laundromat for the Kremlin".

The case has been registered under the BNS sections of 78(2) and 351 and the Kerala Police Act 120(0), the officials added.

The Crime Branch has registered a case on the instructions of the State Police Chief after examining the complaints received by the State Police Chief in this regard, and it was found that they were cognizable offences.

An investigation is underway in the case, and Crime Branch Range Thiruvananthapuram Deputy SP C Binukumar is in charge of the investigation.

Earlier on August 26, Kerala Leader of the Opposition VD Satheesan said that the Congress had set a "shining example" in Kerala's political history by suspending MLA Mamkootathil.

Addressing reporters at the District Congress Office in Kozhikode on Tuesday, Satheesan challenged mediapersons to ques-



tion Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan about "sex offenders in the Chief Minister's Office." He alleged that several CPI(M) leaders continue to hold positions despite multiple complaints about their misconduct.

Congress has shown moral courage. SC grants journalist Abhisar Sharma 4-week interim protection from arrest

Delhi, **Agency:**The Supreme Court on Thursday granted a four-week interim protection from arrest to journalist Abhisar Sharma and asked him to approach the Gauhati high court to challenge a criminal case lodged against him in Assam over a video.

We will protect you, but why are you bypassing the high court," said a bench of justices MM Sundresh and Kotiswar Singh. "We are not inclined to entertain the challenge to the FIR [first information report]. We grant interim protection of four weeks to the petitioner to enable him to approach the high court."Sharma challenged a private person's FIR against him for questioning the state government's move to allot 3,000 bighas of tribal land to a private entity for a cement factory. The video was based on a Gauhati high court proceeding on it. Sharma criticised Assam's government for divisive politics instead of focusing on issues of grave public importance.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, who appeared for Sharma along with senior advocate Vivek Tankha, pointed out that his client has also challenged the validity of the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita (BNS)'s Section 152, a repack-



aged provision of the sedition offence (Section 124-A) under the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

Sibal said Section 152 punishes acts against the country's integrity, sovereignty, and unity. "[It] has become an omnibus provision. They are using it against journalists, and similar matters are pending consideration before this court."

The court agreed to tag the petition with the pending cases on Section 152. Former Army officer SG Vombatkere and Foundation for Independent Journalism, a non-profit organisation that runs the news portal 'The Wire', have filed petitions against this section.In his petition, Sharma called the FIR against him "a classic case of misuse and abuse of section 152 BNS to stifle dissent and journalistic freedom." He added that the prosecution under a provision carrying life imprisonment, over a journalistic video, is grossly inappropriate and a constitu-

tional affront. Sharma, who sought the quashing of the FIR, has been in journalism for over three decades. His YouTube channel has nine million subscribers.

Sharma said he was exercising his freedom of speech and expression to question the government's decision, which cannot amount to an act against the country's integrity and sovereign-

"Criticism of a chief minister's policies and politics cannot by any stretch be treated as an attack on the unity of India. If every dissenting voice against a state government is criminalised as 'anti-national', the constitutional guarantee of free expression becomes illusory," said Sharma in his plea filed through advocate Sumeer Sodhi.

He added that Section 152 has been used to stifle journalistic freedom. Sharma said that such instances are part of a larger pattern of repeated misuse of criminal provisions against journalists and the government's critics.

How many parties among relatives?

During the Himachal Assembly session, another session was held in Una where BJP was not just in opposition but among its own people. Is Congress visible during the Assembly session within its government and as the ruling party? This is not a contest but a tale of uniting hearts in political circumstances. New Delhi, Agency: India is hopeful of resuming negotiations on the proposed bilateral trade agreement (BTA) with the US soon and addressing the issue of high tariffs imposed Washington on Indian goods will be key to striking the deal, a government official said Thursday.

However, the official said the new dates for the next round of negotiations for the agreement have not yet been finalised.

"We are hopeful to get back on the table soon...whenever we strike a deal, both the tariffs (additional 25 per cent and 25 per cent on purchase of Russian oil) need to be addressed," the official said. The two countries started negotiations for BTA in March. So far, five rounds of negotiations have been completed. The US



team, which was scheduled to visit India from August 25, for the next round of negotiations for the agreement, postponed the meeting. The talks are paused as the US is pressing for greater market access in politically sensitive areas such as agriculture and dairy sectors, which India cannot accept as it affects the livelihood of small and marginal farmers.
