Sudarshan Reddy seeks support from all MPs for the Vice Presidential election

Ranchi: Former Supreme Court judge B. Sudarshan Reddy, the opposition's joint candidate for the upcoming Vice Presidential election, questioned who was responsible for damaging Chief Minister Hemant Soren's reputation. Reddy, representing the INDIA bloc, visited Ranchi on Saturday, where he met Soren and later addressed the media.

Reddy, who hails from Telangana, has been nominated by the INDIA alliance as its consensus candidate for the Vice-Presidential poll scheduled for September 9. Speaking at a press conference alongside Hemant Soren, he said that both the ruling and opposition camps were engaged in preparations. Still, for the opposition, the contest was about more than just winning or losing.

"The Vice-Presidential election is not about victory or defeat; it is a fight for principles," Reddy remarked.

Reddy confirmed that he had the support of Soren's MPs and expressed confidence that many more parliamentarians would back his candidacy. "I will request all Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha MPs



to support me if they find me capable. Letters have already been sent to all MPs and, if needed, I will also reach out to BJP leaders," he

Emphasising the constitutional rather than political nature of the role, he added: "MPs who stand for iustice will vote for us according to their conscience."

Turning to allegations against the Jharkhand Chief Minister, Reddy said: "All the allegations levelled against Hemant Soren were baseless. The way he was harassed and the kind of treatment he received have tarnished his reputation. Who is responsible for this?"

He emphasised the importance of preserving the essence of the Constitution, which, he said, embodies equality, justice, fraternity, and dignity, alongside socioeconomic and political values. Reddy also voiced concern over

what he described as new challenges facing democracy. He criticised political parties for overstepping constitutional limits once in power and warned against "new commentary and new narratives" that undermine democratic institu-

"There is no provision for a whip in this election," he noted, adding that the proposed 130th Constitutional Amendment is currently under review by a Joint Parliamentary Committee.

During his visit, Reddy also paid tribute to Shibu Soren, the late architect of the Jharkhand movement and former Chief Minister. known as Dishom Guru.

Senior leaders from the Congress and Jharkhand Mukti Morcha, including Congress in-charge K. Raju and state party president Keshav Mahato Kamlesh, were present at the event.

Self-reliance in Defence is not merely an option, but a condition for survival & progress: Rajnath Singh

New Delhi: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said that in today's era of terrorism, pandemics and regional conflicts, selfreliance in Defence is not merely an option but a condition for survival and progress."It is not about protectionism, it is about sovereignty and national autonomy," the Defence Minister said at a Defence Conclave with the theme 'Warfare in the 21st Century' here today, a Defence Ministry statement said.

He said many developed nations are resorting to protectionist measures with situations of trade war and tariff war becoming increasingly serious. Self-reliance in Defence should not be confused with isolation, he added.

"This is not protectionism. It is about sovereignty. When a nation of youth, energy, technoloand possibilities



the strength that enables India to withstand global pressures and emerge stronger," he said. Hailing Operation Sindoor as a shining example of India's growing indigenous Defence

capabilities, Rajnath Singh said the precise strikes carried out by the armed forces on their targets using indigenous equipment demonstrated that no mission can be successful without vision, long preparation and coordination.

"Operation Sindoor may appear to be a story of a war of a few days, India's victory and Pakistan's

defeat, but years of strategic preparation and Defence preparedness have played a long role behind it," he said, adding that India's forces, through years of hard work and reliance on indigenous equipment, executed the operation effectively and decisive-

The Minister described the 'Sudarshan Chakra Mission' as a gamechanging initiative for India's future security. The mission envisions providing complete aerial protection to critical locations across the country within the next decade, using both defensive and offensive technologies.

Former Jharkhand minister Anosh Ekka gets 7-year jail in CNT land scam case

Ranchi: The CBI Special Court in Ranchi has sentenced former minister Anosh Ekka, his wife Menon Ekka, former Ranchi LRDC Kartik Prabhat, and others to seven years of rigorous imprisonment in connection with a 15-year-old land deal case involving violations of the CNT Act.

The court also imposed fines on the convicts, stating that failure to pay the fine would



oneresult in an additional year sentence for each.

On Friday, the court had found all the accused guilty of

illegally purchasing and selling land by flouting the provisions of the CNT Act.

The quantum of punishment was pronounced on Saturday, when the convicts were produced before the CBI court through video conferencing. The trial was conducted by Special Public Prosecutor Priyanshu Singh on behalf of the CBI.

Anosh Ekka, while serving as a minister, was accused of

misusing his office and using fake addresses to purchase tribal land, with the assistance of then LRDC Kartik Kumar Prabhat. Investigations revealed that large-scale land transactions were carried out with the collusion of administrative officials and staff.

In Menon Ekka's name, land parcels were bought in several locations: 22 kathas in Hinoo, 12 acres in Ormanjhi, 4 acres in Newari, and 9 decimals in

Siramtoli, Chutia, All these purchases were made between March 2006 and May 2008. The CBI successfully proved all charges in court, leading to the convictions. Notably, Anosh Ekka has already been convicted in three other cases earlier-the para-teacher murder case, a money laundering case, and a disproportionate assets case. This is the fourth case in which he has been held guilty.

2400 MW thermal power plant to be built in Pirpainti, Bihar, Adani Power gets the contract

Patna: Adani Power Limited has received a big contract to give a new impetus to Bihar's electricity needs. The company will set up a 2400 MW capacity Greenfield Thermal Power Plant in Pirpainti, Bhagalpur. This plant will provide continuous electricity to the state for 25 years. The contract has been given by Bihar State Power Generation Company on behalf of North and South Bihar Distribution Companies. Now soon the power supply agreement will be done.

Cheap electricity, big investment

In the tariff based bidding, Adani Power offered the lowest rate of ?6.075 per unit. Along with this, the company will invest around ?27,000 crore. 10-12 thousand jobs will be created in the construction phase and 3 thousand perma-

nent jobs after operation. Adani Power CEO S.B. Khyali said, "The Pirpainti project will provide cheap and uninterrupted electricity to Bihar. It will strengthen the state's economy and give a new impetus to industrialization."

India's peak demand is projected to grow from the current ~250 GW to ~400 GW by 2032 and 700+ GW by 2047. To meet this demand, the government has set a target of adding ~100 GW of new thermal capacity by 2035.


Students Can Build Careers Through Sports: Dr. Sunil Kashyap

Police Outpost to Be Reopened in Afzalpur Following Jharkhand Assembly Speaker's Intervention

Jamtara: The longstanding demand of residents of Afzalpur village in Nala block is finally being fulfilled. The Director General of Police (DGP) has issued instructions to establish the police picket in the village. 

Editorial Tariff vs. Tariff Free

America has imposed a 50 percent tariff on India, which has been opposed by countries like China, Russia, Brazil, Australia. It has also been condemned. The agreements and principles of 'Quad' have also been invoked. India could also have imposed a tariff on America, but the Modi government has made cotton tariff-free till December 31. Earlier there was an exemption of 11 percent duty, which was extended till September 30, but now the import of cotton has been made completely free. What kind of Modiism is this or what kind of strategy is this of the government? Got slapped on one cheek and turned the other cheek too! Because of this, cotton imports may double to more than 20 lakh bales during the first three months of the marketing year 2025-26 starting in October. One bale contains about 170 kg of cotton. What will the Indian farmer do? Will he fry pakodas? The argument being made is that this decision has been taken to help and support the exporters of the textile industry, but what will happen to the 60 lakh cotton producing farmers in India? They may not have understood this game of tariffs right now, but when their crop will have to be sold at a price of Rs 1000-1200 per quintal less in the market, then the collective reactions of the farmers will come to the fore. The international prices of cotton are about 20 percent less than the domestic prices. ICE cotton futures are around 67-68 cents (about 9 rupees) per pound. The price of a candy of about 356 kg is around Rs 46,000, while the domestic prices are around Rs 55,000. Our focus is on America, although cheap cotton is also imported from countries like Brazil, Africa, Australia. The question is about the promise made by Prime Minister Modi from the ramparts of the Red Fort. He had said that if anyone wants to play with the interests of farmers, cattle rearers, dairy owners etc., then Modi will stand in the middle like a wall. Has that wall collapsed so soon? Or has US President Trump's tariffism forced our Prime Minister to become a compromiser? Will America gain permission to enter India's agriculture, animal husbandry and dairy products sector in the coming days? In America, less than 2 percent of the people are dependent on agriculture. There is a lot of corn and soybean in America. The American government gives subsidy of more than 65 lakh rupees to farmers. In India, 46 percent of people are associated with agriculture, so they are dependent on it. Most of the farmers are poor and indebted. Loan waivers have also been done, but still farmers are indebted.

Situations like Indonesia are needed to reform leaders

India is one of the largest democracy in the world, where everyone has their own voice with their opinion on policy, but these prolonged disruptions are reducing the capacity of the Parliament. What result do we get at the end of the day, and how much do we gain from the discussions? Parliament makes its own rules and regulations, it is up to the members to follow those rules and regulations for the effective functioning of legislative bodies. How long will this continue...

Riot police fired several rounds of tear gas at thousands of stone-pelting students trying to reach parliament in Indonesia 's capital. These students had reached there to protest against the lavish allowances of parliament members. The protesters were angry with recent reports that 580 members of the House of Representatives have been receiving a housing allowance of 50 million rupiah per month from September 2024. The allowance given to MPs per month is 20 times more than the income of an Indonesian citizen per month. 580 members of Îndonesia's parliament are being given Rs 5 crore (\$ 3075) as allowance September 2024. Corruption is rampant in Indonesia and activists say that the police and parliament members are widely considered corrupt in a country with a population of more than 28 crore. Looking at the attitude of the leaders, it seems that such a situation is developing in India sooner or later. Ministers, MPs and MLAs are not really concerned about the condition of the people of the country. In the monsoon session of Parliament, 120 hours were allotted for discussion in the Lok Sabha, but only 37 hours of discussion took place. Due to the uproar, the public lost money worth several hundred crores of rupees as the proceedings were stalled. Due to the continuous interruptions, the proceedings could run actively for only one-third of the time.

A large part of this was the discussion on Operation Sindoor. Most of the time was spent in uproar, due to which bills were passed without adequate discussion. Despite 285 questions being asked in the Rajya Sabha, only 14 questions were answered during the session. For 20 consecutive days, opposition parties associated with the India Block created a ruckus and protested inside and outside the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha on the issue of re-inspection of the voter list in Bihar. Due to this, the proceedings of both the houses were disrupted a lot. Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harvansh said in his concluding speech on the last day of the monsoon session that overall, the House was able to function for only 41 hours and 15 minutes. The productivity of this session was disappointingly only 38.88 percent, which is a matter of serious introspection. From this, it can be guessed how serious the elected public representatives are for the country's interest. No work means no salary, no one raises voice on this issue in Whether Parliament functions or not for any reason, it does not matter to the MPs. They get full salary and allowances. No one even discusses cutting it on the basis of nonfunctioning. Umesh Patel, an independent MP from the Union Territory of Daman and Diu, was the only MP who raised this demand. He had said that if the

House does not function, then the MPs should not get the allowance. He claimed that MPs do get the allowance, but the public work is not done. He had alleged that the House is not being allowed to function due to the ego of both the ruling and the opposition, while the opposition parties are blaming the govern-ment for this. He said that the salary and other benefits of MPs should be stopped if there is no work in the House. The ruling party and the opposition blame each other for stalling the proceedings of Parliament, but when it comes to increasing the salary and allowances, everyone unites. There is no debate on this. There is no analysis of how much productivity the MPs have had in lieu of the salary and allowances. When the country celebrates its 79th Independence Day, the Parliament did not function for even 79 hours during the monsoon session. In the monsoon session of the country's Parliament, Lok Sabha did not work for 83 hours. Due to this, public money worth Rs 124 crore 50 lakh was wasted. Rajya Sabha remained stalled for 73 hours, due to which Rs 80 crore was wasted. This means that Rs 204 crore 50 lakh was wasted in both the houses. In the Parliament, where MPs cannot work even for an hour, the public sends them with the responsibility of 5-5 years.93 percent of the MPs sitting in Parliament are crorepatis, who currently get a salary of Rs 1 lakh 24 thousand every month. The parliamentary constituency allowance is Rs 84 thousand. The daily allowance of MPs is Rs 2500. Including salary and allowance, every MP is given Rs 2 lakh 54 thousand every month from the public money. MPs leave no chance to stall the proceedings of Parliament by creating ruckus in the name of national interest, but when it comes to increasing salaries allowances, everyone unites. Last year, the salary of Members of Parliament was increased by 24 percent. The new salary was considered effective from 1 April 2023. With this, the monthly salary of MPs has become Rs 1.24 lakh in addition to some allowances and facilities. The government said that the salary of MPs was increased in view of rising inflation. At the same time, additional pension was announced for every year for former members for more than five years of service. It has been said that the daily allowance has been increased from Rs 2000 to Rs 2500. The pension of former MPs was increased from Rs 25000 per month to Rs 31000 per month. The additional pension for each year of service over five years was increased from Rs 2000 per month to Rs 2500 per month. They have been given this facility under the MP Salary, Allowance and Pension Act of 1954. Review is done every five years: Since 2018, the salary and allowances of MPs are reviewed every five years. This review is based on the inflation rate. In 2018, the law for the salary and allowances of MPs was amended.

Not only this, if someone dies in the family, his last rites also have to be performed...

There is a neglected class in the society which has been struggling with lack of money for decades. Due to lack of regular income, such a person who supports his family by hard labour, neither got a government job nor any special grant from the government to improve his standard of living. Due to this, this class is continuously getting trapped in the web of poverty. By working hard, with great difficulty that person managed to arrange two meals a day for the family. He took a loan from his relatives and built a small two-room concrete house for the family to live in. Only the head of the family knows how the daily life of that family is going on. But in the eyes of the government, he is not poor. His concrete house is visible, but no one can see under what circumstances he did all this.

Due to the criteria set by the government, such families are not even included in the list of IRDP (fami-

The worry of how much loan has been taken on the house and how to repay it keeps troubling him day and night. His financial condition has always been bad. Such a family is not able to take advantage of the government welfare scheme due to its complex process. Therefore, such a person lives his and his family's life in penury. For the families suffering from lack of money, former Chief Minister Late Virbhadra Singh had made a scheme during his tenure that if any member of the family was not in a government job, one member of that family would be given a government job. The process for this had also started. At that time, such certificates had also started being made through SDM or Tehsildar that no member of the said family was in a government job. During this time, it also happened that some influential people separated their children from the family and got such certificates made for them too. Due to the indif-

lies living below the poverty line). ferent attitude of the officials, this scheme died before reaching any goal. Some people did benefit from it, but a large section of the population was deprived of it. During the Janata Party's rule in 1977, the then Chief Minister Shanta Kumar started the Antyodaya Yojana. The poor class benefited a lot from it. Shanta Kumar was a strict Chief Minister. Therefore, the selection of families for the Antyodaya Yojana was done with great transparency. At that time, the state's economic condition was good and there was no unemployment like today. Employees did not have such high salaries. At that time, many youths got employment in the government sector. At that time, there was a lot of food crisis as well.A large part of the common man's income was spent on buying grains. At that time, grains had also become cheap. This class living in the society is following its customs with great difficulty. It is living with brotherhood. It has to educate its children. After that, it has to send

them to some small training institute for training. After this, the children of that person living in poverty, after getting educated and trained, join the long queue of unemployment. After a lot of effort, they are able to get a job of ten to twelve thousand rupees in the private sector away from home. There they have to live in a rented room. There is also expenditure on food and drink. Overall, nothing is left with them. Not only this, the parents also have to get their children married in time. Lakhs of rupees are spent on this. Not only this, if someone dies in the family, his last rites also have to be performed as per rituals. After crossing the age of sixty, a person's body starts giving up and all his property, earned with every penny, is lost. During the tenure of the former BJP government, some employment may have been provided in the government sector, but they simplified the conditions for social security pension for elderly people above the age of sixty years.

This provided some relief to those who were not in government and semi-government jobs. Retired employees and income tax payers were not eligible for this. All elderly women who had crossed the age of 70 were brought under the ambit of social pension. Eligible elderly people who have crossed the age of sixty may have got some benefit, but they started getting a monthly pension of one thousand rupees. The two and a half year rule of the Sukhu government of Congress has been completed, but the pension of elderly men is still one thousand rupees per month. That too is not being given regularly. Some other relief has been received from the Prime Minister Kisan Samman Nidhi of the Modi government at the Center. With this, elderly farmers are getting an amount of five hundred rupees every month. It often happens that the children of a person who is not in a government job are not able to get training in a good institute.

Confident we will stick to fiscal deficit target: DEA Secretary

New Delhi, Agency: the April-July fiscal data. Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) Secretary Anuradha Thakur Saturday expressed confidence that India will meet its fiscal deficit target of 4.4 per cent for 2025-26, despite the first quarter showing a wider deficit than last year.

In an exclusive interview with media, Thakur underlined the government's commitment to fiscal discipline while stressing the strength of India's economic funda-

"On the overall year number, we remain confident that we will be able to stick to the fiscal deficit target we had set, and we will be able to maintain that," she stated,

India's fiscal deficit for April-July stood at Rs 4.68 lakh crore, or 29.9 per cent of the 2025-26 target, compared to 17.2 per cent during the same period last year.

Thakur, however, dismissed concerns that the performance quarterly would impact annual projections. "Fiscal deficit number for Q1 is not indicator for the full year. Because on monthly or quarterly basis, there could be temporal mismatches between the flow of non-debt receipts expenditures," explained.

In her Budget speech, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had set the responding to concerns over Revised Estimate for fiscal



deficit in 2024-25 at 4.8 per cent of GDP, with the Budget Estimate for 2025-26 projected at 4.4 per cent of GDP.

Commenting on the Q1 2025-26 GDP growth of 7.8 per cent, Thakur said, "Q1 numbers reflect resilience of our economy. It reflects strengthening of the momentum in the economy, and it is anchored in strong macroeconomic fundamentals.'

She pointed to robust performance across sectors, with manufacturing, construction, and engineering showing strong activity.

Agriculture demonstrated awe-inspiring growth, supported by a good Rabi harvest and excess kharif sow-ing compared to the previous

"We have a good buffer stock. We witnessed good rainfall. Our growth outlook is good," Thakur added, citing agricultural strength as a

basic nomic momentum.

On the demand side, Thakur noted that domestic consumption remains the primary growth driver for the Indian economy. "In our economy, net exports don't contribute so much," she said, highlighting the economy's reliance on internal demand rather than external



It is only after considering these that a woman can be counseled whether egg freezing is a possibility and a suitable solution for her or not.

When should you consider freezing your eggs?

A woman's personal situation and timeline needs to be taken into consideration before egg freezing. Dr. Goel adds, "If she is already in a relationship and wants to conceive naturally in the next 6–12 months, egg freezing cannot be considered the best choice since natural conception will have better chances at that point of time. But in situations where women have not yet decided to become mothers because of personal or professional issues, egg freezing in their late 20s and early 30s is generally held to be the most appropriate. This is the age when the eggs are in optimal quality and there are more chances of an ensuing successful pregnancy down the line through IVF."

Impact of freezing eggs after 35 Egg quality and quantity both deteriorate after age 35, affecting whether IVF or freezing eggs will be successful. Though it is technically possible to freeze eggs at age 35 and above, the result might not be as good as if done for a person who does it earlier. There are primarily concerns from the majority of women who wait, that thawed and frozen eggs do not provide successful embryos in the future, even after costly and emotional efforts.



"Pretty." A fan even complimented her hairstyle, writing: "Rubina, your straight hair looks really nice."


