Heavy Rainfall Likely in Seven Districts of Jharkhand on September 15

Ranchi: The Meteorological Department has issued a yellow alert predicting heavy rainfall in seven districts of Jharkhand on September 15. Along with heavy rains, strong winds blowing at 30 to 40 km/h and lightning strikes are also expected in these areas.

The districts forecasted to experience heavy rainfall include Deoghar, Dumka, Giridih, Jamtara, Godda, Sahibganj, and Pakur, mainly located in the northeastern part of the state.

Additionally, adjoining central regions of Jharkhand may also witness scattered heavy showers.

The department has also issued alerts for strong winds and lightning for September 13 and 14 across the state. On Friday, Ranchi and nearby areas experienced mostly clear weather with sunny intervals, though some cloud cover was present intermittently. In the past 24 hours, the highest rainfall was recorded in East Singhbhum's Dhalbhumgarh with 58.4 mm, closely followed by Ranchi at 56.4 mm. Temperature-wise,

SaraiKela recorded the highest at 36.7°C, while Latehar recorded the lowest at 20 6°C On Friday, the maximum temperatures recorded were: Ranchi 31.4°C, Jamshedpur 35.4°C, Daltongani 35°C, Bokaro 32.2°C, Chaibasa 34.4°C, Khunti 32.6°C, and

Lohardaga 30.9°C.

<u>Agency</u> Kathmandu: Nepal's former Chief Justice Sushila Karki has officially become the interim Prime Minister of the country after she took oath of office on Friday night, four days after former PM KP Sharma Oli quit following massive anti-corruption protests against his government. She is the first woman to hold the office of Nepal's prime minister.

Nepal's President, Ram Chandra Paudel, administered the oath of office to Karki at his residence at around 9.30 pm India time. She took oath under Article 80 of the Constitution of Nepal.

A formal announcement on the next general elections to be held within the next six months is likely to be



Karki may also recommend imposing emergency, considering the current situation in the country.

Following the Cabinet's recommendation, the President is expected to give approval, and the state of emer-

gency will come into effect across Nepal.

Earlier on Friday, Nepal's Gen Z group announced that they agreed to accept the leadership of Sushila Karki, laying out several conditions - including the dissolution of Parliament as a key demand.

At a press conference, a faction of the protesting Gen Z group, "We Nepali Group", confirmed that a broad consensus had been reached. A veteran jurist and known for her tough stance on corruption, Karki is an alumnus of Benaras Hindu University (BHU). According to local media reports, Karki said that she was offered a job at the iconic university but turned down the offer as her "destiny was different". **FOLLOWED**

Ranchi: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) state president and Leader of Opposition Babulal Marandi on Thursday launched a fresh attack on the Hemant Soren-led government, accusing it of attempting to hand over Jharkhand's sand ghats to mafias and middlemen under the guise of new auction rules.

Addressing a press co ference at the BJP state headquarters, Marandi alleged that the government's slogan of employing local youth was a "deception" and that the latest sand ghat policy was designed to benefit contractors with political connections rather than tribal and unemployed

Marandi said the state

imposed in liquor contracts, which described as "anti-people and exclusionary."

"These conditions ensure that poor, unemployed. tribal and backward class people cannot participate. Only those with prior deals and political settings will qualify," Marandi alleged.

He criticised the state's

decision to cluster more than 500 sand ghats into district-level groups, arguing that the move would make it easier for powerful contractors to monopolise sand mining rights. Citing examples, he said that in Godda district, 16 ghats had been placed in a single group, while Dumka district had 31 ghats divided across three groupsMarandi claimed that under this system, once environmental clearance is obtained for a single ghat within a group, sand extraction could legally take place across all ghats in that group - a loophole he described as a "conspiracy to legalise illegal mining."

In areas prone to land subsidence and gas leakage, urgent steps must be taken to relocate affected residents.

SC seeks Centre, ECI response on PIL for regulation of political parties

Union government and the and for the Union govern-Election Commission of India (ECI) on a public interest litigation (PIL) demanding a statutory framework to regulate political parties and check their alleged misuse as conduits for black money and criminal activity.

A bench of justices Surya Kant and Joymalya Bagchi issued notice on the plea filed by advocate Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay, while suggesting that he also implead all recognised and registered political parties since any directions in the case would directly affect

New Delhi, Agency: The frame comprehensive rules Supreme Court on Friday governing registration and sought responses from the functioning of political parties ment to enact legislation to curb what it described as the of corruption, "menace casteism, communalism, criminalisation, and money laundering in politics".

Relying on recent income tax raids, the petition, filed through advocate Ashwani Kumar Dubey, highlights how little-known political outfits are allegedly being used as vehicles for laundering unaccounted wealth.

On July 13, 2025, raids on the Indian Social Party and Yuva Bharat Atma Nirbhar Dal reportedly unearthed The PIL has urged the black money worth ?500 court to direct the ECI to crore, with the entities



accused of accepting cash donations through hawala channels and returning the money via cheque after deducting a 20% commission. The details, carried in newspapers, have been annexed to the petition. Similarly, an August 12, 2025 raid exposed another outfit, the National Sarva Samaj Party, where authorities allegedly seized ?271 crore in unaccounted funds from office bearers' res-

The plea contends that such "shell parties" are floated solely to convert black money into white, adding that many office bearers have seri-

ous criminal antecedents, qualifications, and indirectly including charges of trafficking, extortion, kidnapping, rape, and contract killings, while enjoying police protection under the cover of poli-

"Nearly 90% of registered parties never contest elections and exist merely as conduits for illegal funds," the petition claims, adding that bogus leaders flaunt SUVs with hooters, oversized nameplates, and live off illicit cash while projecting political legitimacy.

Upadhyay's petition underscores that political par-Upadhyay's ties wield extraordinary power under India's constitutional framework, binding legislators under the Tenth Schedule, recommending dis-

shaping the election of the President, Vice-President and chief.

ministers. Yet, unlike companies, cooperatives, or trusts, parties remain outside any comprehensive regulatory framework.

Currently, Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act (RPA) provides only for registration of parties, while Section 29C mandates disclosure of donations above 20,000. "There is no law to ensure internal democracy, transparent funding, or accountability," states the plea, pointing out that despite being substantially financed by the State, political parties are not treated as "public authorities.

New Delhi, Agency: Two Maoists were killed in a gunfight with security forces Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district on Friday, a day after a senior Maoist leader was suspected to be among nine Left-wing insurgents dead in a gun battle in the central Indian state. People aware of the matter said the fresh gunfight broke out during a search operation that was launched after security forces were tipped off about the presence of Maoists in Bijapur. The gunfight was still underway even as security forces refused to specify its exact location and the strength of the forces involved, citing operational rea-

be among them. Krishna, also known as Balanna, Ramachandar, and Bhaskar, was the secretary of the Odisha State Regional Committee and a member of the Maoist Central Committee. He joined the Maoist movement in 1983. An officer on Thursday said Krishna was likely to be among those killed, even as the identification of the bodies was being car-

Maoists have lost top leaders this year amid heightened anti-Maoist operations. The government has set a target of eliminating Maoism from the country by

A June 23 Maoist Central Committee document acknowledged the killing of 357 Maoists over the last year. Maoist chief

Kesava Rao alias Basvaraju was killed on May 20. Basvaraju's killing inside a dense Chhat tisgarh forest marked the most significant success against the Leftwing insurgency in years.

'Don't shout': Heated exchange between lawyers during Sunjay Kapur's inheritance case hearing



New Delhi, Agency: A heated exchange was witnessed in the Delhi High Court on Wednesday during the hearing of a lawsuit filed by Bollywood actor Karisma Kapoor's children seeking a share in their late father Sunjay Kapur's assets.

The fiery verbal exchange took place between the counsel representing Karisma Kapoor's children Samaira Kapur and Kiaan Raj Kapur, and the advocate appearing on behalf of Priya Sachdev Kapur, Sunjay's third wife. A video shared by Bar and Bench showed Mahesh Jethmalani, the senior advocate representing Karisma Kapoor children saying "don't shout at me" after Rajiv Nayar, the senior advocate representing Priya Kapur snapped at him saying "don't interrupt me".

The incident took place on Wednesday, the day the Delhi High Court directed Priya Sachdev Kapur to file a comprehensive list of all movable and immovable assets belonging to Sunjay Kapur. Justice Jyoti Singh was hearing the arguments in the case when tempers suddenly ran high between the advocates. Please don't interrupt me, I am not used to interruption," Rajiv Nayar said, at which Jethmalani fumed, saying: "You should get a taste of your own medicine then, and don't shout at me... I'm not a pushover".Bollywood actor Karisma Kapur's ex-husband Sunjay passed away on June 12 this year, and their children have now moved court accusing their father's third wife Priya of forging and fabricating his will.

Sonauli border in UP reopens after four days amid Gen Z protests, unrest in Nepal



New Delhi, Agency: The Sonauli India-Nepal border in the Maharajganj district of Uttar Pradesh reopened on Friday after being closed for four days amid ongoing unrest in Nepal due to the widespread Gen Z protest in

The reopening has allowed trucks carrying essential goods to cross over into Nepal, following days of suspension that left hundreds of truck drivers stranded on the Indian side.

During the closure, transporters faced significant losses as perishable goods such as onions, coconuts, and raw materials began to spoil. With tensions still high across parts of Nepal, many drivers expressed continued concern about safety while entering the country. One truck driver named Vishnu, transporting coconuts from Tamil Nadu to Kathmandu, shared his experience, stating that he was stuck at the border for four days and hoped that the situation in the country would be "good".

"We were stuck here for four days. The borders opened here; hopefully it is all good even ahead in Kathmandu, Nepal... I am a little scared... We were struck here, but we had all the food and water," he said. The border closure was a direct result of the violent Gen Z-led protests that have rocked Nepal in recent days, triggered by the government's social media ban and broader political instability and corruption in the country. Amid a severe fuel shortage in Nepal, trucks are also now entering India from Nepal to purchase petrol and diesel. A truck driver coming from Nepal said, "There is no fuel there. The Nepal government has sent us to India to buy fuel. All petrol pumps in Nepal are closed... I hope the situation improves and India-Nepal relations grow stronger."

"We are going to India after 8 days... There's no fuel available in Nepal," another driver added.

Meanwhile, the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) has so far apprehended 67 inmates, including a woman, while they were attempting to cross into India through various checkpoints along the India-Nepal border after fleeing different jails in Nepal amid the ongoing unrest. Meanwhile, the death toll from the protests in the Kathmandu Valley has climbed to 34, as reported by The Himalayan Times, citing data released by the of Health Ministry and Population of Nepal.

Drunk UP youth dies after neighbour slaps him to stop brawl with his father

Jagdeep Chhokar, credited with role in major electoral reforms, dies at 81

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) co-founder Jagdeep Chhokar, who was associated with major electoral reforms in the country, died on Friday. He was 81. A retired Indian Institute of Management professor, Ahmedabad Chhokar was also a lawyer and engineer who served in the Indian railways.

ADR achieved landmark victories in the courts under Chhokar's leadership. The Supreme Court empowered

New Delhi, Agency: voters with the right to know the criminal, financial, and educational backgrounds of candidates in the 2002 Union of India vs ADR case. The verdict in the People's Union for Civil Liberties vs Union of India (2013) case introduced the "None of the Above" option electronic voting machines. In the Lily Thomas case (2013), the Supreme Court mandated the immediate disqualification of lawmakers convicted of crimes carrying a sen-



tence of over two years.

ADR was one of the petitioners in the electoral bond case. In 2024, the Supreme Court struck down the 2018 electoral bond scheme of political funding, declaring it "unconstitutional" as it completely anonymised contributions made to par-

ADR was among the petitioners against the Election Commission of India (ECI)'s June 24 notification for the special intensive revision (SIR) of the electoral roll in poll-bound Bihar. On Monday, the Supreme Court ordered that Aadhaar must be accepted as the 12th valid document for inclusion in the roll.

Rising food costs push consumers toward discount stores, bulk buying, and homegrown produce: PwC

New Delhi, Agency: With 63 per cent of consumers expressing concern over rising food prices, cost-conscious behaviour is on the rise, according to a recent survey report by PwC.

The report added that nearly half of those worried about food costs are changing their shopping habitsm, opting for different stores, discount outlets, and promotional deals to stretch their budgets.

Additionally, 44 per cent of respondents are buying in bulk, while an equal number have turned to growing their own food to counteract inflation.

The survey found that 74 per cent of consumers in the report stated that their food choices were deeply rooted in cultural heritage and longstanding traditions. This suggests that companies that provide functional heritage foods (e.g. aam panna and jeera-flavoured drinks) which appeal to culture, tradition and nostalgia will have an edge.

Globally, for consumers, value (price, promotional offers, rewards) is the most important factor when choosing food items. In India, however, quality (i.e. taste of product) dictates which food items consumers are going to buy. Indeed, 40 per cent of consumers ranked taste among the



top three factors when selecting food items, while 39 per cent ranked price, and 38 per cent listed high nutritional value as their top three decision-making factors.

PwC says that about 84 per cent of consumers surveyed were extremely or very concerned about food safety. Respondents also expressed concerns over ultra-processed foods, pesticide use, and the levels of additives and preservatives in food. Health benefits, including higher nutritional value, were in fact cited by consumers as the primary driver for switching brands, followed by better taste and better value for money. Interestingly, half of the consumers believe that food producers and manufacturers are responsible for incentivising healthy and nutritious eating. The report further added that more than 70 per cent of consumers have used supermarkets for grocery shopping in the last year, 60 per cent have used local retailers, and 55 per cent have used an ondemand grocery delivery platform. Moreover, 46 per cent are buying readyto-eat meals, 41 per cent are ordering takeout, and 38 per cent are eating out at

Ceat expects biggest boost for tractor, bike tyres after GST rate cuts, CEO says

New Delhi, Agency: Ceat Ltd. expects demand for its tractor and commuter-motorcycle tyres to surge the most due to GST rate cuts, according to its chief executive offi-

We expect sales of commuter motorcycles to go up in semi-urban and rural households, and farm sales also could go up," Arnab Banerjee told Reuters in an interview.

On 4 September, the Narendra Modi government announced GST rate cuts on hundreds of items—from soaps to small cars and motorcyclesin India's biggest indirect tax reform since the Goods and Services Tax was first introduced on 1 July 2017. The new, simplified GST structure reduces the tax of most tyres to 18% from 28% earlier, while tractor tyres will attract 5% tax versus 18% earlier.



The changes are effective 22 September.

Ceat will pass on the tax benefits in full to customers.

According to Ceat, the farm sector accounts for a tenth of its annual revenue, while commuter motorcycleswhich make up the bulk of twowheelers sold in India—are among its biggest segments. Ceat does not disclose the revenue it earns from this business. The company gets about 53% of its revenue from replacement demand, 28% from automakers, and the rest from exports.

That said, Ceat is likely to grow its revenue in the double-digits in FY26, led by replacement demand in the two-wheeler and commercial-vehicle categories, Banerjee had said during an earnings call in July.

In the April-June quarter, Ceat's revenue grew 10.5% year-on-year to ?3,530 crore, due to sales of twowheeler, truck and bus tyres. In Fiscal 2025, revenue grew 14%.

New Delhi: A new Lancet study finds an alarming trend in India's health map: the nation has experienced an increase in deaths due to chronic non-communicable diseases (NCDs) between 2010 and 2019. The increase was larger, particularly among women aged over 40, with heart disease, diabetes, and strokes dominating.

Public health experts caution that lifestyle changes, an ageing population, and unequal access to healthcare are driving this trend. The study suggests that India has to double up on prevention, detection, improved healthcare delivery in order to stem the growing burden of NCDs.
